What are the Benefits of AICE Cambridge Coursework for Your Student?

Students may take one single Cambridge AICE class, or they can take several required AICE classes and earn the prestigious AICE Diploma, and pass exams and potentially earn college credit while still in high school. The curriculum in an AICE class is rigorous and prepares a student for entrance into universities and colleges. It is recommended that a student have earned a 4 or 5 on FAST ELA or Math previously to be prepared for an AICE class. To determine if any college credits may be awarded for passing AICE scores, see your university or college for more details.

What is an A Level Course Versus an AS Level Course?

AS Level Course

The AS Level is the first half of an A Level course. In Florida, AS Level courses are commonly taken alone and still count toward **Bright Futures** and GPA weighting.

Key features:

- **Duration:** Typically **1 academic year**
- **Depth:** Covers **foundational concepts** of a subject
- **Assessment:** Exam taken at the end of the course
- **Credit:**
 - Can stand **on its own** as a qualification
 - Earns **college credit** at many U.S. colleges (including Florida public institutions)
- **Workload:** Less intensive than full A Level
- **Best for students who:**
 - Want to try advanced coursework without committing to two years
 - Prefer breadth across multiple subjects
 - Need flexibility in their academic schedule

A Level Course

A Level represents the **full, two-year course of study** and includes AS content plus additional advanced material.

Key features:

- **Duration: 2 academic years**
 - Year 1: AS Level content
 - Year 2: A Level content (more complex and in-depth)
- **Depth: Significantly deeper** analysis, applied learning, and subject specialization
- **Assessment:** Exams typically taken at the end of the second year
- **Credit:**
 - Often earns **more college credit** than AS Level
 - Highly valued by selective colleges
- **Workload:** More demanding (advanced writing, research, and synthesis)
- **Best for students who:**
 - Want deep specialization in a subject
 - Are pursuing the **AICE Diploma**
 - Plan to study the subject in college

What are the Benefits of Advanced Placement (AP) Courses for Student?

AP courses provide academic rigor, enhance college and scholarship opportunities, strengthen learning skills, and help students stand out in competitive postsecondary environments, making them a valuable option for students seeking academic challenge and college readiness. Many universities and colleges reward college credit for passing AP scores. See your university or college for more information.
