

Mastery of General Knowledge

SLPS Human Resources Department

Educators may satisfy the General Knowledge (GK) exam requirement via one of the following methods:

- **Option 1** Advanced degree earned from an accredited college/university in any major.
 - Mail an official paper transcript to FLDOE and ensure the SLPS Human Resources Department has a copy.
- **Option 2 -** Two years of full-time college teaching experience.
 - Contact the SLPS Certification Specialist to discuss 772-429-7512.
- **Option 3 -** Valid alternative assessment scores. See the qualifying scores requirements below.
 - Email the official score reports to the SLPS Certification Specialist.
 - This option concludes effective June 30, 2029.
- Option 4 Satisfy waiver requirements.
 - See requirements below on page 2.
- Option 5 Pass subtests 1-4 of the General Knowledge Test (GK)
 - Essay Subtest
 - English Language Skills (ELS) Subtest
 - Reading Subtest
 - Mathematics Subtest

Effective July 1, 2024, the following alternative assessments may satisfy the GK exam requirement if the following criteria are met:

- GRE test was taken on or after July 1, 2015.
- SAT, ACT, and CLT test were taken on or after March 1, 2016.
- The minimum required score on the GRE, SAT, ACT, and CLT was earned during the ten (10) years immediately preceding application and qualification for a Professional certificate.
- Passing scores are required in each of the four general knowledge areas.

Certification Exam Waivers

Waiver of the General Knowledge Exam

- The educator fails one or more sections of the GK exam.
- AFTER failing the GK exam, the educator receives three years of support and instruction from the district designed to help pass the GK test.
- The educator has a <u>summative</u> evaluation rating of effective or highly effective for the three most recent years that the educator was rated (three years immediately preceding the upgrade to a Professional certificate).

Additional Information

- Educators who do not attempt the GK exam within the applicable timeframe and who do not meet the GK requirement via a master's degree or college teaching experience will need to pass the GK exam in order to upgrade to the Professional Educator Certificate. <u>An</u> <u>attempt should be made no later than the second</u> <u>year of the temporary certificate (See timeline below).</u>
- ❖ To use the GK waiver, educators must submit proof of their GK exam attempt (score report) to the SLPS Certification Specialist.

Waiver of the Professional Ed Exam

- 1. The educator completes the professional prep courses (PPC) listed on their Statement of Eligibility (SOE) by taking college courses.
- 2. The educator completes the district's professional education competency (PEC) program.
- 3. The educator has a <u>summative</u> evaluation rating of effective or highly effective for three years.

Additional Information

❖ Teachers whose Statement of Eligibility only lists exams as the requirement, who did not complete a district professional education competency program (PEC), and who did not complete professional prep coursework while employed in a Florida school district will need to pass the Professional Ed exam (PET). These criteria will mostly impact teachers who received a Temporary certificate based on completing an out of state education program or whose Professional Certificate expired.

Waiver of the Subject Area Exam

An educator must have a master's or higher degree from an accredited university or college with a degree major in a corresponding area to the exam. Please contact the SLPS to discuss – 772-429-7512.

Note: Charter/private school evaluations will not be accepted for the use of an exam waiver if they do not contain a Student Growth component.
