- A17. References can be submitted as name and date.
- Q18. "f) provide scientifically based research or evidence-based documentation (can include EdReports and ESSA Evidence)" Our research report by itself would exceed the maximum requirement of 8 pages. Please clarify what the expectation is for this requirement.
- A18. Please select the most relevant materials for submission.
- Q19. Are we required to type in the Required Response Form? Upon downloading the PDF, I don't see an option to type. Is it acceptable to write/print the entries instead onto the form and scan?
- A19. Yes, you can print and scan.
- Q20. We are a small business designing and manufacturing hands-on manipulatives. Is this RFP only for curriculum or can I submit a proposal for hands-on materials as well?
- A20. It is for supplemental curriculum.

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- Q21. Does an executive summary need to be submitted as an "All Other Required Attachments" doc or embedded in each Evaluation Factor response?
- A21. I will add a section on Bonfire to submit the Executive Summary.
- Q22. Is an all-digital solution acceptable? If not, is St. Lucie seeking both print and digital or print only?
- A22. We are seeking print tools that can also have a digital component.
- Q23. Other than the specific grade bands listed, would St. Lucie consider programs that serve portions of the grade band, i.e., if the RFP states K-5, would St. Lucie accept a program that only covers grades K-2 or 3-5?
- A23. It can be a subset of grade levels.
- Q24. Is the District requesting to receive samples at the time of the RFP opening? If so, what are the sample quantities, the ship to address and contact information for receiving vendor samples?

- Q25. Is this RFP for purchase and implementation Fall of 2023 or is this to place awarded vendors on a list of approved vendors?
